At our October board meeting, we talked about the coming Christmas season and the traditions we have here at Ansgar Church. We decided to hold a family service on December 14, and we hope some of our children and youth will join in by singing in the Lucia procession or helping with the nativity play. We will continue the lovely tradition of going around singing Christmas carols for those who find it hard to make it to church. That will take place on December 6. It is such a lovely tradition - one I have only ever seen in movies, where it always looks cozy (and a little cold!).

The tradition of singing Christmas carols actually began in Italy. St. Francis of Assisi, who founded the Franciscan order, started the first nativity scenes back in 1223. He built small models of the stable in Bethlehem and arranged plays there to bring the Christmas story to life. Along with the nativity scenes came songs - simple Christmas carols that ordinary people could sing along with, not just the monks.

One of these songs, originally written in Latin, was "Adeste Fideles." It was later translated into "O Come, All Ye Faithful." Before long, many of these songs were translated into everyday languages so everyone could understand and sing them. In England, small groups began going around towns in the evenings during Christmas time, singing carols to welcome the season.

The word "carol" originally meant a circular dance, and many carols still carry that cheerful, dance-like feeling. The lyrics tell the story of the Nativity - though over time, some songs wandered a bit from the biblical account!

When Christmas Carols Were Banned

In 1647, Oliver Cromwell came to power in England. As a Puritan, he wanted to strip the church of anything that might distract from true worship. Under his rule, Christmas celebrations were toned down, and singing carols was actually



banned. But people kept the songs alive in secret. Then, in the mid-1800s, during the Victorian era, two men, William Sandys and Davis Gilbert, collected and published the old carols from villages across England, and the tradition came alive again. From there, it spread across the world - even to us here in Edmonton.

The Nine Lessons

Today, Christmas carols are still sung in the streets and in churches at special candlelit services. One of the most famous is the Christmas Eve service at King's College, Cambridge, where nine Bible readings lead listeners through the

story of salvation - from Creation, through the Fall, the prophecies of a coming Savior, the birth of Jesus, and finally, a hymn of praise to Christ. Between each of the nine readings, the congregation sings carols together. The first service of this kind was held in 1918, to mark the end of World War I, and it has since become a beloved tradition around the world.

This year, we will hold a similar service on December 21, the winter solstice, where we listen to the nine readings and sing carols together. With so much unrest and conflict still in our world, we need, more than ever, to gather around and share the message of peace. There are so many good reasons to come together in church in the coming months - to listen to God's Word, to sing in His honour, and to meet one another in fellowship and joy.

Sing, choirs of angels!
Sing in exultation,
Sing all ye citizens of heaven above!
Glory to God in the highest:
O, come let us adore Him,
Christ the Lord!

You will also have the opportunity to light a candle in memory of someone you personally miss at the service.




